- Community Development Block Grand (CDBG) Funding: •
 - **Disaster Recovery** ۲
 - Formula-based •
 - National Disaster Resilience Competition (NDRC) ullet
 - Competitive grant process
- DuPage County is eligible from April 2013 flood









- Awards total up to \$1 billion to eligible applicants.
- Competition involves two phases:
 - Phase 1
 - Asked to demonstrate unmet needs
 - Phase 2
 - Asked to design a resilient project/programs
- State of Illinois, Cook County & City of Chicago also eligible









- Applicants must demonstrate unmet need from April 2013 in:
 - Housing ۲
 - Infrastructure ۲
 - **Environmental Degradation** ۲
 - **Economic Revitalization**
- To receive funding,
 - Area must meet HUD's low-mod income requirements.
 - Area cannot have duplicate benefits from other funding. ullet
 - Project or program must protect for future events.









- Recovery
 - Actions done in response to an event
 - Necessary repairs, but not necessarily improvements
 - DuPage County is still recovering from April 2013 flood
- Resiliency
 - How can communities better prepare themselves for future weather events? ٠
 - What will/can a community look like 20 years from now?
 - What tools/education/resources are needed to make communities stronger?
- **Being Resilient Helps Us Recover Quicker**









- April 2013 flood severely affected the East Branch communities.
- Ongoing recovery efforts include:
 - Home & business repairs
 - Flood-prone property buyouts
 - Flood mitigation projects
- HUD has confirmed that the area has unmet needs in:

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- Housing ullet
- Infrastructure •



STUDY

- Developing a watershed plan is the first step in the process to create more resilient communities.
- Plan addresses flooding in the watershed by including:
 - Big Ideas/Infrastructure to Protect
 - Flood Mitigation/Water Quality Projects, etc.
 - Institutional Changes
 - Government, Organizations, Policy, etc.
 - **Behavioral Changes**
 - Residents, Business Owners, etc. ullet













In addition, it includes a resiliency framework by addressing these issues:

- Health & Wellbeing
- **Economy & Society** \bullet
- Infrastructure & Environment \bullet
- Leadership & Strategy









- During NDRC Phase 1, DuPage County developed and East Branch DuPage River Watershed & **Resiliency Plan.**
 - The Watershed Plan includes:
 - Unmet needs from April 2013 flood •
 - Flood-prone area identification ۲
 - Conceptual projects local and regional
 - Water quality components
 - Watershed Plan data compiled from:
 - East Branch Steering Committee •
 - Local Non-Profits ۲
 - **Public Agencies**
 - **Residents and Business Owners**










- The Plan identified the Village of Lisle as having the largest amount of unmet need from the April 2013 flood.

- Improve the levee to a FEMA certified degree of protection.















